**E. Board of Education and Administration Comments**

Michael McCain commented on how great the band has been sounding during their practices.

Daniel Dombrowski stated that the new school year and the varsity football team were off to a great start. He reported that the issue of class sizes at the high school was being addressed.

Philip Thomas thanked the principals for their revised building newsletters which are easier to read and provide useful content to parents and the Board.

Timothy Houlihan shared positive comments he's heard from St. Isaac Jogues families about Lakeview during their football team's recent use of the athletic field.

Michael Wenner stated he attended the Jefferson Middle School Meet the Teacher Night. He also commented that he was very impressed with the smooth start to the school year.

Donald Wheaton announced that the Boys' Cross Country team won the MAC Gold Jamboree earlier this evening. He extended his kudos to all on the start of the school year. He has received positive comments from parents. He also mentioned Banned Book Week which is celebrated September 25<sup>th</sup> through October 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Carol Herbon questioned the lack of a crossing guard at Lakeview High School by 11 Mile and Ruehle.

Donald Wheaton acknowledged that today was the anniversary of the writing of the Star Spangled Banner. He encouraged everyone to read all the verses.

Philip Thomas informed the Board that the marching band will be in competition at Novi on September 25<sup>th</sup> and that all are welcome to watch the band practice on Monday's and Wednesday's in the evening. The band does a run through of the full show at 7:45 PM on those days. The band will compete in five shows this year.

Karl Paulson commented on the start of the school year with the completion of the summer's bond work, planning for 2011 and other future work. He will provide the Board with an update on Friday. He announced that the District received a response from the State Planning Review Office that the state approved the proposed changes to the baseball field project at Princeton. Work will be scheduled to begin soon.

Sean Zaborowski confirmed that he has spoken to Steve Rewers, Barton Malow, that we're ready to begin the work on the field and that, weather permitting, crews should be able to work through November 2010 preparing the field.

Timothy Houlihan requested that the list of field repairs/maintenance be included with the Friday Board Update.

Karl Paulson announced that state finances are still in disarray and that the latest news includes that the school aid fund may be borrowed to the General Fund. He encouraged all to send messages to their legislators on how they feel about the state's current school aid funding.

Daniel Dombrowski requested administration to look into the crossing guard situation in front of the high school.

Sean Zaborowski provided some history about the use of the crossing guard over the past two years due to bond work construction and inaccessible side walks in front of the building. Now that construction is complete, the District encourages students to go to Little Mack and 11 Mile Rd. to cross with the light and crossing guards.

William Putney informed the Board that the crossing guard that was posted on 11 Mile Road was a District employee; not a city crossing guard. The use of our own crossing guard held the District accountable if anything happened during crossing. After the bond construction work was done, the city requested that we no longer use our employee at this crossing.

Daniel Dombrowski suggested the District contact the Macomb County Road Commission or city to study the traffic and students crossing to see if a flashing yellow crossing light might be warranted before and after school.

Philip Thomas suggested a parent letter to be sent home stating drop off of students should be done through the parking lot or in front of the high school and not across 11 Mile Road. He also suggested removing the cross walk lines that currently go across 11 Mile Road.

Timothy Houlihan requested that the city analyze the crossing situation.

Mr. Paulson stated that Sean Zaborowski, Principal Brent Case and Officer LaTour would be looking into the situation.

Tracy VanPeeren shared that she has received positive comments from our new enrollees and staff.

**F. Student Representative Report**

Student Representative Hannah Lampron reported that the start of the school year has been going great and that she has heard positive comments from our new students. She also shared that the 9<sup>th</sup> grade mentoring program (P.A.S.S.) was going well and that she is a mentor this year.

Sean Zaborowski announced the "Pink Huskies" Project which will involve the 9<sup>th</sup>, JV & Varsity Volleyball team on Thursday, September 16<sup>th</sup> and the Varsity Football team on Friday, September 17<sup>th</sup>. The teams will be playing in fundraising (cancer) games for Gilda's House.

The Homecoming Game is scheduled for Friday, October 1<sup>st</sup> and the dance will be held Saturday, October 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Mr. Dombrowski canvassed the Board and no one will be attending the 2010 Delegate Assembly on November 4, 2010. Lakeview will not have a voting delegate or alternate.




