

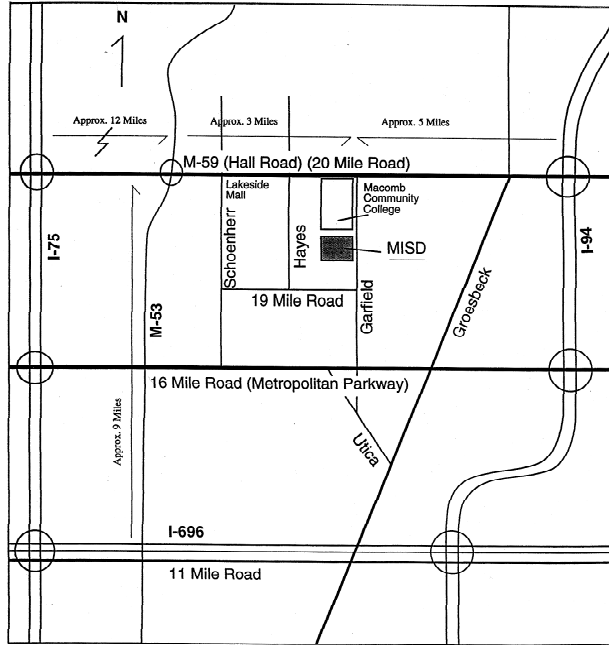
MR. RICHARD PAUL

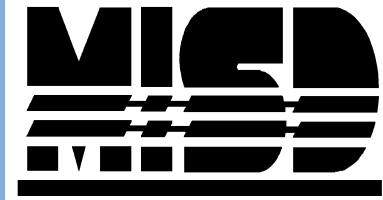
