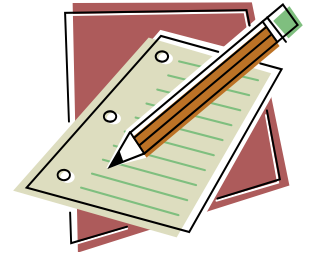

Parents/Guardians and Students,

I am Mrs. Sullivan and I will be your 7th Grade Math teacher. My goal is for each student to have a positive and successful experience in math. In order to reach this goal, there are a few things about my class that are important to know.

Materials Needed:

1. One 1” or 1.5” binder with 5 tabbed sections
2. PENCILS, PENCILS, PENCILS
3. 1-subject spiral notebook to be kept in the binder
4. A soft pencil case—the kind that can be kept in a 3-ring binder
5. I have a class set of graphing calculators that will frequently be used during class. You are not required, but may wish to invest in one for home use. The TI-84 Silver Plus Edition is the recommended model and will be used through high school.

Grades:

- Grades are based on the number of points received for homework, class work, projects, tests and quizzes. **Assessments are worth 80% and daily work 20% of their overall grade.**
- Each quarter is worth 23% of their final grade and their final exam is worth 8% of their final grade.

Homework:

- Students will receive a Weekly Skills Packet each Monday that is due the following Monday. They will also receive lesson reflections that should be completed by the assigned due date.
- Late work will **not** be accepted. Students will be given a weekly homework check that counts as their homework grade for the week. Failure to complete work as it is assigned will result in poor homework check scores.
- *Any student with a disability may discuss his or her needs with me. Grading and homework policies can be flexed to meet specific needs.

- All parents with Internet access will have the ability to monitor progress and check student grades at any time using PowerSchool. The school will provide you with your username and password. Students will also be maintaining an Assignment Sheet—this will be kept in their binders so that they are aware of their current grade at all times.

Mrs. Sullivan's Class Procedures



Behavioral Expectations:

- Be prepared by having your binder, homework and a pencil EVERY day.
- Be on time for class.
- Be considerate of others. Keep your hands, feet and negative opinions to yourself. Listen to others while they are speaking (this includes me).
- Be respectful of the materials in the classroom and the materials that belong to you and other students.
- Be responsible for your learning. Listen during instruction. Ask for help when you need it. Be an active member of the class.

Homework:

- YOU NEED TO DO IT!!! Late work will NOT be accepted
- Homework is due the following day at the BEGINNING of class unless otherwise specified. You will be given a Weekly Homework Check that counts as your homework grade for the week. In order to be successful you must complete the work and make the necessary corrections.
- You will receive a skills packet every Monday. It is due the following Monday.

Starters:

- Pick up a starter sheet from the back table every Monday. You will use the same sheet all week.
- You are expected to begin working on the starter immediately and will have approximately 5 minutes to complete it.
- Starters will be included in the weekly homework checks.

Absences:

- It is your responsibility to find out what you missed!
- If you are absent, look at the assignment board to see what you missed. Also, check the crate on the back table for any notes or handouts that you may have missed. You have 1 day for each day absent to make it up. Please speak to me if you are absent for an extended period of time. I will work with you on quiz/test make-ups and due dates.

Personal Organization:

- You will need a 1-inch binder and five tabbed sections. You are expected to maintain your binder and use it to organize your assignments, notes, tests and quizzes. There is a place for you to store your binder in the classroom, if so desired.
- You may take binders home as long as you bring them back the next day.
- You will take an end of the year assessment and maintaining your binder will be a tremendous help to you in the long-run.

Extra Credit:

- Extra credit is offered on a weekly basis. You will find a new opportunity each Monday. Check the red pocket folders by the calculators.
- All extra credit must be turned in by Friday of each week.

Games:

- There are a variety of games located in the cabinet near the calculators. You may play with the games if you have finished the work for that day. They may not be played during instruction.
- Make sure all of the game pieces are returned to the proper box or container and returned in a timely fashion.
- Failure to take proper care of the games or arguing over the games will result in the loss of this privilege.

Options When Finished Early:

- Work on your skills packet.
- Work on the available extra credit.
- Review your math flash cards or other study helpers created in class.
- Play in-class games.
- Read a book.
- Work on assignments from another class.
