- Fulfilled all requirements of Lakeview's Graduation requirements in association with the Michigan Merit Curriculum
- A student who earns a 3.75 GPA
- Earned either a 1 or 2 on all sections of the Michigan Merit Exam
- Taken at least two AP courses
- English I-IV (AP English can be substituted for English IV)
- Physics 9, Chemistry, Biology, and one additional science course
- Completed Pre-Calculus
- 2 years of the same foreign language
- Students meeting the criteria will be awarded highest honor cords

Graduating with Honors

- Fulfilled all requirements of Lakeview's Graduation requirements in association with the Michigan Merit Curriculum
- A student who earns a 3.5 GPA
- Earned either a 1 or 2 on at least (2) sections of the Michigan Merit Exam
- Meets all general graduation requirements
- Students meeting the criteria will be awarded honor cords

COURSE RETAKE & SCHEDULING POLICIES

- Students are allowed to reschedule one (1) failed required course within their high school career
- Other failed required courses must be taken in summer school, after school credit recovery, or adult education program at the student's expense: \$250 per credit hour

Make It or Break It Year

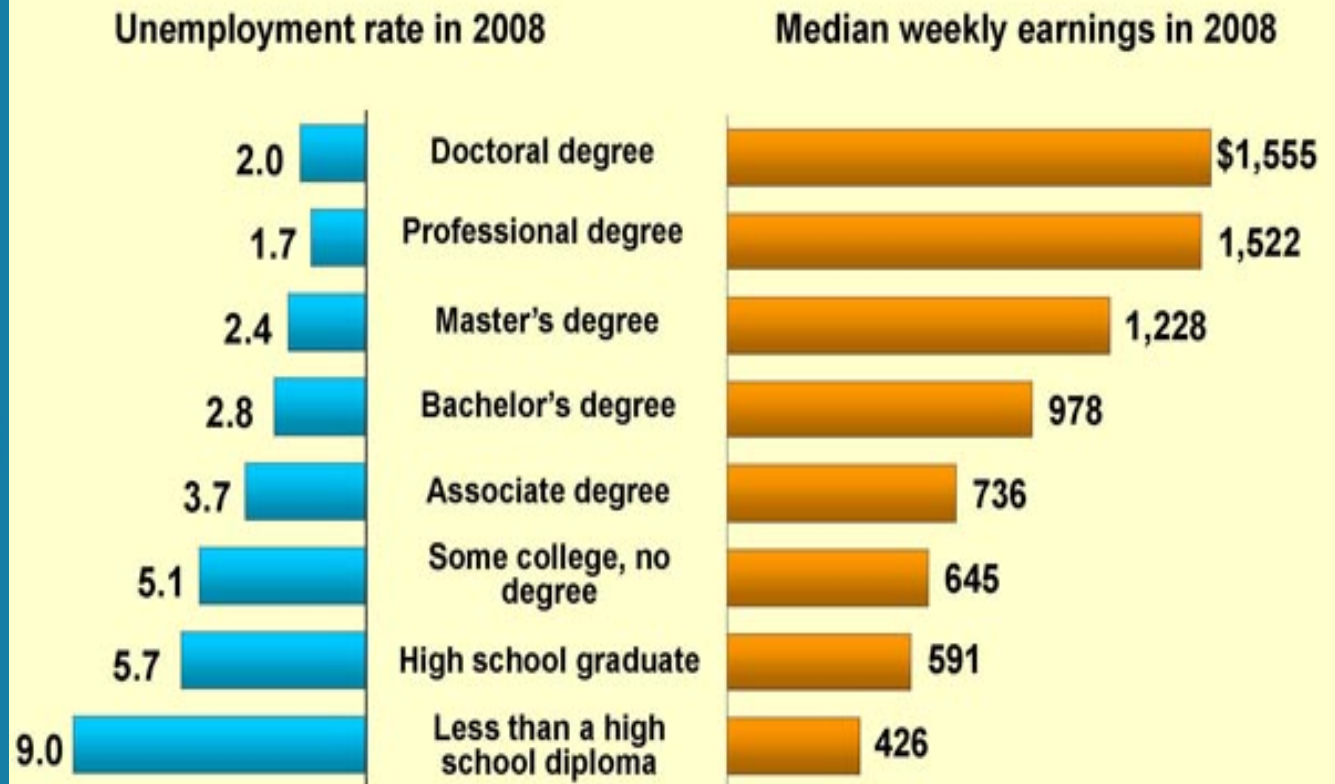
- 95% with a B average their freshman year graduate.

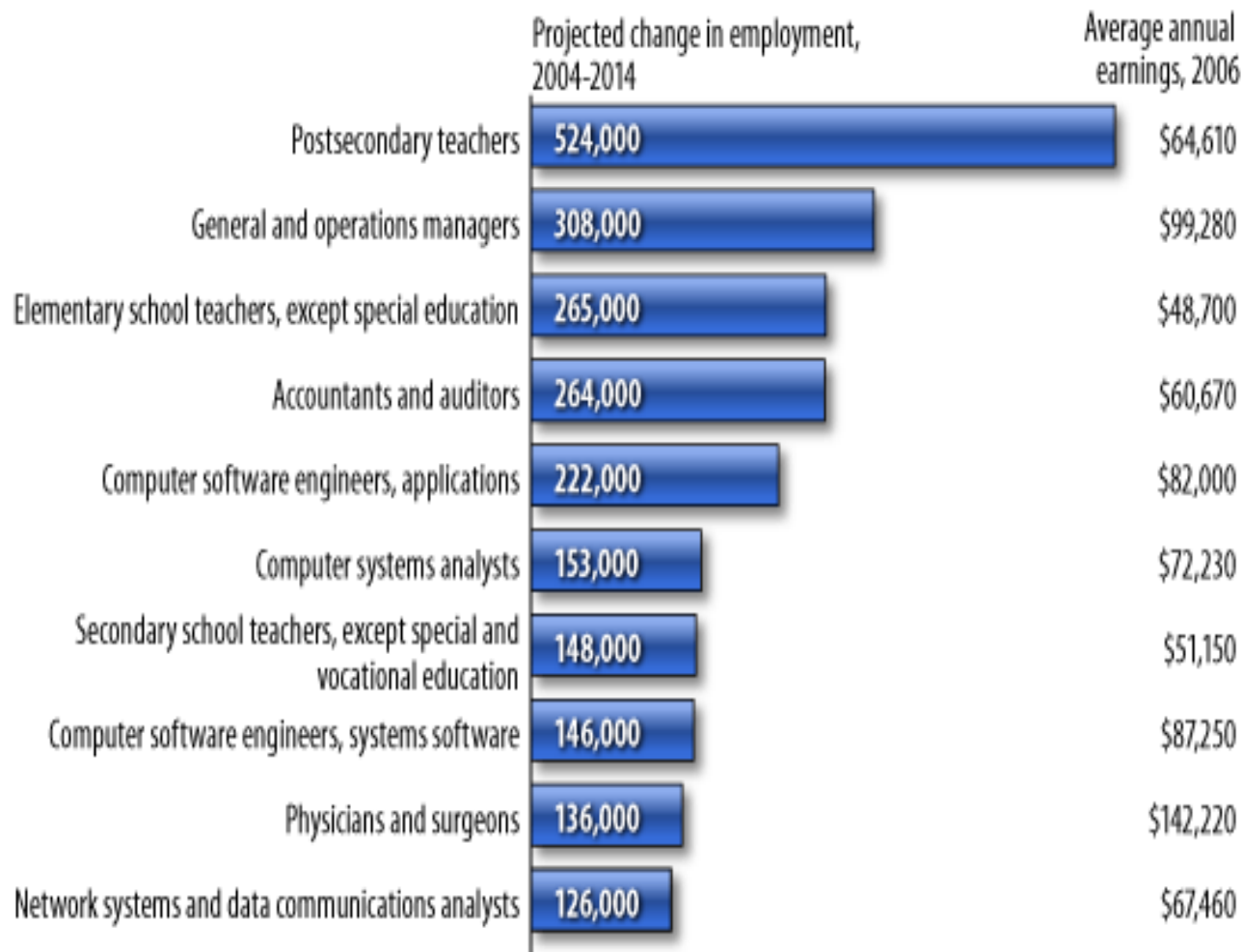
