Graduation Requirements

- 4 English credits - Eng I, II, III, IV
- 3 Math Credits - Alg I, Geo, Alg IIA & IIB or Acc Alg II
- 1 Senior year Math or Math Related course
- 3 Science Credits – Physics 9, Chem, Bio
- 3 Social Studies Credits – World, US, Econ/Gov
- 1 Health Credit
- 1 Physical Education Credit
- 1 Visual, Performing, Applied Arts Credit
- 11 Electives
- **28/32 including all required courses above needed to graduate**

Traditional 10th Grade Courses

- English II
- World History/Geography
- Alg IIA & IIB or Accelerated Alg II
- Chemistry
- Health
- Elective Options

*** All core courses can be accelerated if prerequisites have been met

LHS Credit Recovery

- Only allowed to reschedule 1 course during high school
- Online recovery courses through Education 2020 program
- After school and summer programs
- \$250.00 per credit
- Mandatory attendance policy

Attendance Policy

The District expects all students to attend a minimum of 90% of the school days scheduled for the school year. If a student falls below this threshold at any time during the year, warning notifications and discipline, referral to truancy, up to and including being dropped from attending may result.

Graduating with Honors

Graduating with Highest Honors

- Fulfilled all requirements of Lakeview's Graduation Requirements in association with the Michigan Merit Curriculum
- Minimum 3.75 Cumulative GPA
- Earned either a 1 or 2 on all sections of the Michigan Merit Exam
- **Taken at least two AP courses**
- Completed 2 credits of the same foreign language
- **Completed Pre-Calculus**
- Completed one additional science course besides Physics, Chemistry, or Biology
- Students meeting the criteria will be awarded highest honor cords

Graduating with Honors

- Fulfilled all requirements of Lakeview's Graduation Requirements in association with the Michigan Merit Curriculum
- Minimum 3.5 Cumulative GPA
- Earned either a 1 or 2 on at least two (2) sections of the Michigan Merit Exam
- Students meeting the criteria will be awarded honor cords

Advanced Placement (AP) Courses

- LHS offers 6 courses:

AP Biology

AP Chemistry

AP English Literature

AP Statistics

AP Calculus

AP U.S. History

- Students will receive college credit if they receive a qualifying score on the AP exam.

- 1-5 Range

- 3-5 qualifying

- Courses follow a rigorous nationally recognized curriculum which prepares students to take the subject area AP test that Lakeview Public Schools will pay for.

- Colleges and Universities want to see AP classes on their applicants transcripts

WSU Dual Enrollment

- WSU classes taken at Lakeview High School
- LHS – provides 1 FTE for every class taken
- Current offerings:
 - Computer Science 1100
 - History 1000
 - Psychology 1020
 - Philosophy 1000

Test Dates for Sophomores

- Practice – Decommissioned Act Plus Writing will be given: Tuesday, March 6, 2012
- NWEA testing math, reading, and language usage will be given 2 times during the year
- Scores from these tests are used to place students in future courses and seminars

What to do in 10th Grade

- Continue to take and plan challenging high school courses
- Continue to meet with your counselor at least once a year to discuss schedule and career options
- Research the education/training different careers require
- Compare your decommissioned ACT results in 10th grade with your parents and counselor with your 9th grade PLAN test results to measure growth
- Start collecting college information
- Visit colleges and talk with college students
- Be ready with a list of questions to ask on your campus visit
- Use this list of college characteristics to decide how to evaluate different colleges
- Begin filling out the college comparison worksheet
- Consider your reasons for going to college and how they relate to your career interests
- Join /continue extracurricular activities
