Attendance Policy

- The District expects all students to attend a minimum of 90% of the school days scheduled for the school year. If a student falls below this threshold at any time during the year, warning notifications and discipline, referral to truancy, up to and including being dropped from attending may result.

Graduating with Highest Honors

- Graduating with Highest Honors
 - Fulfilled all requirements of Lakeview's Graduation Requirements in association with the Michigan Merit Curriculum
 - Minimum 3.75 Cumulative GPA
 - Earned either a 1 or 2 on all sections of the Michigan Merit Exam
 - Taken at least two AP courses.
 - Completed 2 credits of the same foreign language
 - Completed Pre-Calculus
 - Completed one additional science course besides Physics, Chemistry, or Biology
 - Students meeting the criteria will be awarded highest honor cords

Graduating with Honors

■ Graduating with Honors

- Fulfilled all requirements of Lakeview's Graduation Requirements in association with the Michigan Merit Curriculum
 - Minimum 3.5 Cumulative GPA
 - Earned either a 1 or 2 on at least two (2) sections of the Michigan Merit Exam
 - Students meeting the criteria will be awarded honor cords
- If a student has received credit only in a class due to attendance issues (no grade given), he/she will not be eligible for any of the mentioned recognitions (Valedictorian, Salutation, Top Ten).

Advanced Placement (AP) Courses

- LHS offers 6 courses:
 - AP Biology
 - AP Chemistry
 - AP English Literature
 - AP Statistics
 - AP Calculus
 - AP U.S. History
- Courses follow a rigorous nationally recognized curriculum which prepares them to take the subject area AP test that Lakeview Public Schools will pay for.
- Students will receive college credit if they receive a qualifying score on the AP exam.
 - 1-5 Range
 - 3-5 qualifying
- Colleges and Universities want to see AP classes on their applicants transcripts

College Applications

- College Visits
 - Hopefully already visited college over the summer
 - Admissions representatives visit Lakeview
- Complete college applications
 - Apply online
 - Submit high school form to counselor
 - Counselor will send official high school transcript directly to the college or university
 - Proof-read, proof-read, proof-read!!!!

Letters of Recommendations

- Ask well in advance
- Provide relevant information
 - Letter of Recommendation Form
 - What the letter is for (i.e. college, scholarship)
 - Resume (grades, activities, community service)
 - Provide Stamped Addressed Envelope

Fall of 2011

- Keep grades up. Study every night. Stay organized. **Use your planner.**
- Have all college applications submitted before Thanksgiving.
- Print out a copy of what was submitted and keep it in a folder/ binder just for college information. Also keep the login and password for each online application that was submitted.
- Re-take the ACT if you are unhappy with your previous test scores.
