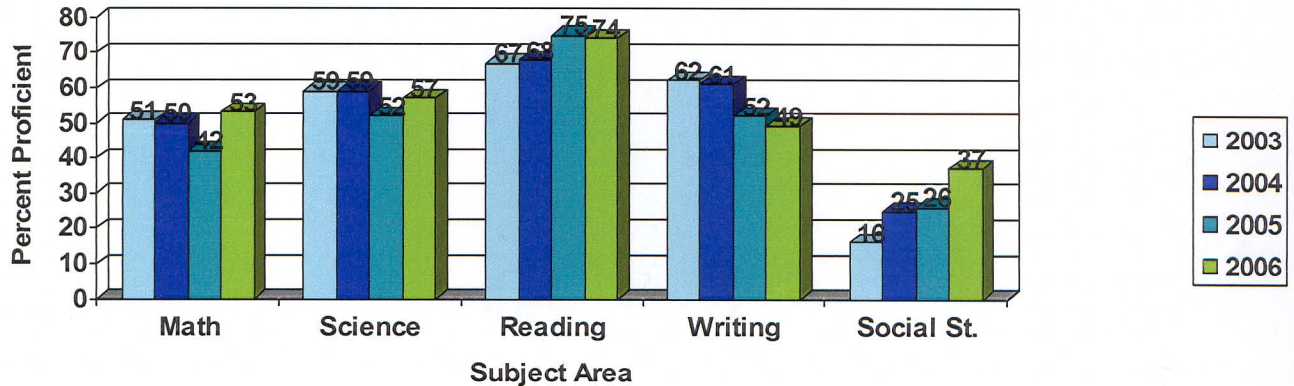


Lakeview Public Schools - Lakeview High School MEAP Class Summary Results Percent Proficient - Levels 1 and 2



The above data reflects four year MEAP results for the Lakeview High School graduating classes of 2003 through 2006.

The data from the class of 2006 is an analysis of MEAP scores as 11th grade students were tested in the spring of 2005, retested in the fall of 2005, and retested in the spring of 2006.

When comparing the graduating class of 2006 with the class of 2005, achievement has increased over the two year period in mathematics, science, and social studies. There has been a very slight decrease of 1% in reading and 3% in writing.

The four year trend indicates that math and reading have steadily increased. There has been a significant increase in social studies from 16% to 37%. Science remains consistent throughout the four year trend. Writing has decreased from 2003 to 2006 from 62% to 49%.

When comparing Lakeview Public Schools to districts in the vocational education consortium, Lakeview Public Schools has the highest scores for the graduating class of 2006 in English, mathematics, social studies, and science. Lakeview Public Schools is the second highest scoring district in the consortium in writing.

When comparing Lakeview Public Schools to similar size districts within Macomb County, Lakeview has the second highest scores of all districts in the areas of mathematics, social studies, and science. Lakeview Public Schools is higher in all content areas when compared to Warren Woods Public Schools and Mt. Clemens Community Schools. Lakeview Public Schools is higher in all content areas, except English (behind by .7%), when compared to Center Line Public Schools.

When comparing Lakeview Public School’s Class of 2006 MEAP results with Macomb County, Lakeview scored higher in all content areas. When compared with statewide results, Lakeview scored higher in mathematics and reading, equal to statewide results in science and social studies, but lower than the statewide results in writing by 6%.

When comparing Lakeview Public Schools with all districts within Macomb County, Lakeview Public Schools placed 5th in mathematics, 4th in reading, 4th in science, 3rd in social studies and 12th in writing.

The data above reflects an increase in social studies for the 11th grade tested in the spring 2006. However, there has been a decrease in reading, writing, mathematics and science from 2005 to 2006.

Lakeview High School is in the process of an item analysis of the spring MEAP 2006 results. The specific identification of weak areas in reading, writing, mathematics and science will guide the instructional process for the 2006-2007 school year. It is anticipated that when the class of 2007 results are finalized (after retesting) significant improvement will result in the 2006 scores.

Adequate Yearly Progress and the Michigan School Report Card

Lakeview High School received a composite letter grade of “C” on the Michigan School Report card for the 2005-2006 school year.

Lakeview High School did not make Adequate Yearly Progress 2005-2006 due to the special education subgroup (a subgroup of 31 students) not meeting state proficiency levels in mathematics.

Lakeview High School instructional staff and administration are committed to address the need for improved student achievement through school improvement plans, curriculum mapping, course and textbook selections with the goal to improve achievement for all students. With the opportunity for MEAP retesting as 12th grade students, it is anticipated that the MEAP scores for the graduating class of 2007 will increase significantly.
